A Bill

***Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the
Republic of Texas in Congress assembled:***

Sec. 1. Known as House Bill No.11-04-3-2007 / Senate No. 2007-04-003

Sec. 2. Where as the following was Approved, 15th January 1839, (AN ACT Entitled an act fixing the standard of Silver and Gold Coin in this Republic) is hereby amended to read as follows. That the standard value of Texas silver and gold coins shall hereinafter be based upon the Texas dollar being defined as 28.3495 grams of .999 fine Silver or 00.95 grams of .999 fine Gold, and is hereby adopted for use by the Constitutional Government of this Republic.

Sec. 3. Be it further enacted, That this act shall take effect immediately and be in force from and after its passage.
